Dear Incoming 3rd Grade Families,

Congratulations on making it through another school year! I hope the next few weeks provide you all with some well-earned rest and relaxation! I'm excited for our upcoming year together, and look forward to working with you all! In order to ensure a smooth transition into 3rd grade, I've attached a few items in the packet. Included are a supply list of materials, math and reading homework, and a summer reading list.

Regarding the supply list, OLMC has once again partnered with School Tool Box this year to provide our families with the opportunity to order your items. You are able to place your order online by visiting the site and ordering your child's supply kit. **All orders are due by Sunday, July 14.** The supplies will be delivered to OLMC and be ready for your child on the first day of school. If you would rather shop for your own supplies, you may do that as well, but School Tool Box provides a more cost effective way of doing your back-to-school shopping.

A list of suggested reading books for the summer is also included in the summer work packet. Your child can choose a book that's not included on the list if they would like, it just needs to be grade level appropriate. Students must read at least **3 books** and complete the two book report forms included in the packet. In addition, the attached short stories must be read and the questions must be completed.

The addition and subtraction sheets must be completed as well. It is important that children practice their addition and subtraction facts throughout the summer, as it is important that they come to 3rd grade with a strong understanding of their facts. We'll be learning multiplication, division, and fractions next year, and it is vital that they know basic addition and subtraction.

Every bit of practice helps! In addition, a letter regarding Mathletics is attached to the packet, and children should put in at least three sessions a week on there. Any certificates they earn can be printed and brought to school on the first day.
