Supply List

All supplies should be brought in on the first day your child attends school,

Please write your child's name on all these items as well as

ALL articles of clothing (uniform and cubby clothes)

- 1** regular size book bag (no wheels or pull-up handles)
- 2** two-pocket folders labeled with your child's name
- 1** box thin Crayola crayons - 16 count
- 1** bottle of Elmer's glue - 8 oz.
- 2** large glue sticks - .77 oz
- 1** box thick washable markers
(please no thin or Mr Sketch scented)
- 1** pair Fiskars blunt scissors

- 1** Smock, preferably with sleeves
- 2** rolls of paper towels *
- 2** boxes of tissues *
- 2** boxes of baby wipes *
- 1** medium sized bottle of hand sanitizer *

Cubby Clothes (labeled)

2 complete changes of clothes
Please include a couple of pairs of underwear, socks,
pants (shorts) and shirts (short sleeved.)
This will be changed as the season changes

This is a special request for parents of boys: Please have them wear pants with an elastic waist. You may buy these anywhere as long as they are navy blue. The boys have a very hard time working with zippers, buttons, and belts.
