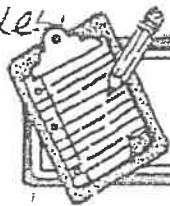
Math: You are expected to know the basic addition and subtraction facts as well as the times tables up to 10. This is crucial to be successful in 4<sup>th</sup> grade math.

I hope you have a wonderful summer!

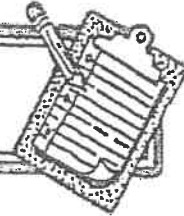

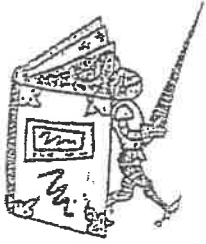
